

Clinical Site Tips

What To Look For

When initiating the selection process for a potential clinical site near you, hospitals may appear to be the most apparent choice; however, exploring imaging clinics can also be helpful.

Remember, if your emphasis is on general concentration, it's crucial to choose a site that offers services in both abdominal and OB/GYN areas. Conversely, if you are focusing on the vascular concentration, ensure that the site performs vascular examinations.

Rotation Expectations

Students must complete their clinical rotation during the fall and spring semesters, beginning with 24 hours per week and advancing to 32 hours per week in the final summer semester.

Make sure that the facility you choose can accommodate the required hours for your clinical rotation each semester.

For scheduling, students will attend their clinical rotation at the most convenient times, which may vary based on the site's scheduling preferences. Typically, this will align with regular business hours to coordinate with the schedules of staff and patients.
