COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course presents further study of popular music harmonic techniques. The student will learn extended chords, work with the II-V-I progression, and learn chord substitutions, voice leading, and 3 and 4 part upper structures of chords.

COURSE OUTCOMES AND COMPETENCIES:

Students who successfully complete this course will be able to:

- 1. Continue to develop their understanding of the structure of music.
- Be able to write chords using proper voice leading principles.
- Be able to compose melodies using good structure.
- Be able to transpose melodies.
- 2. Incorporate this knowledge when composing more difficult music.
- Be able to compose music using borrowed and altered chords.
- Be able to compose melodies applying all the non-chord tones.
- 3. Learn more ways to harmonize melodies.
- Be able to choose substitute chords in all keys.
- Be able to modulate using several common methods.

- 4. Analyze more difficult compositions.
- Be able to provide harmonic analysis using Pop Chord Symbols.
- Be able to provide harmonic analysis using Roman Numeral Symbols.
- Be able to provide a formal analysis using phrase structures.
