### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course is a continuation of MUSI 184: Private Guitar III. Private music instruction for guitar provides interested students with the opportunity to learn more about guitar music and guitar skills. Beginning students will learn basic guitar music theory and technique, and develop sight-reading and musicianship skills. More advanced students will gain better understanding of interpretation of the repertoire they are studying and will learn to analyze compositional techniques found in guitar literature. All students will be given an opportunity to perform in the semester recital.

### **STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

1. The student will demonstrate knowledge of the instrument appropriate to his/her ability.
2. The student will demonstrate proper technique appropriate to his/her ability.
3. The student will demonstrate musicianship skills appropriate to his/her ability.
4. The student will demonstrate stylistic interpretation of repertoire appropriate to his/her ability.

### **STUDENT COMPETENCIES:**

Students will be given an entry assessment at their first lesson. The competencies expected will be based on this assessment. The instructor will prepare a weekly course outline stating the competencies expected. This will be given to the student at the second lesson followed by regular progress reports throughout the semester. The instructor will give an exit assessment at the last lesson to determine if competencies have been met.
