COURSE TITLE: TOPICS IN HEALTH CARE
ALTERNATIVE AND COMPLIMENTARY THERAPIES

SEMESTER CREDIT HOURS: 1

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This elective course for health care consumers or health care professionals covers a variety of topics. Courses developed for professional audiences are eligible for submission for approval for continuing education credit required for re-licensure as an LPN or RN in Kansas. This course is designed as an introductory to alternative and complementary therapies for health care providers. The study of how alternative therapies affect health care and the community will be explored. This course will help the learner understand unconventional therapies and prepare them to address questions surrounding this topic in health care.

COURSE OUTCOMES AND COMPETENCIES:

Students who successfully complete this course will be able to:

1. Demonstrate understanding of alternative and complementary therapies.
 - Identify common alternative and complementary therapies used in healthcare.
 - Define alternative therapy and complementary medicine.
2. Utilize alternative therapies when planning care for individuals, families, and communities.
 - Determine the impact alternative therapies have on health care.
 - Develop a plan of care using alternative therapy.
3. Effectively identify and incorporate appropriate alternative therapies in caring for clients with low risk health needs.
 - Explore common alternative therapies used in society in relation to health.
 - Identify two types of alternatives therapies used in health care.

4. Identify teaching needs of alternative therapies for individuals, their families, and communities with low risk health care needs.

- Develop a teaching plan for the client/community to increase awareness of alternative therapies.
- Display teaching plan/education projects to a community group to increase awareness of alternative therapy.

5. Collaborate with other members of the health care team in evaluation common alternative therapies and resources to effectively provide care for individuals, families and communities with low risk health needs.

- Identify alternative therapy for specific health conditions.
- Discover alternative therapy organizations that could enhance collaboration with healthcare members.
