The Commencement Ceremony tonight marks the 102nd Commencement of Labette Community College. Labette Community College was founded as Parsons Junior College in 1923 on the top floor of the old high school at 26th and Main. Then in 1926, the new Parsons High School building opened at 2719 Main and the college occupied the top floor. The College relocated to its present campus in the former East Middle School at 14th and Broadway in 1963 and became Labette Community Junior College in 1966. In 1978 the College was renamed Labette Community College.

The College has evolved from a city college primarily serving those students who wished to transfer to a four-year institution to a comprehensive community college offering transfer degrees, professional/technical degrees and certificates, continuing education, customized training for business and industry, lifelong learning opportunities, and a variety of programs and services for Southeast Kansas and the four-state region.

Cardinal Citation

The Cardinal Citation Award is presented annually at Commencement. This is the highest honor that is bestowed on an individual for lifetime achievement by the Labette Community College Alumni Association and LCC. The criteria are: nominee must be a living person who has had significant lifetime achievements to his or her profession, community, state, or nation; nominee must have a current or past association with Labette Community College; nominee does not have to be a graduate of LCC.

Cardinal Citee Dr. Trinity Davis



Dr. Trinity Davis is an award-winning educator, curriculum design expert, and national advocate for educational equity whose work is transforming how teachers are recruited, prepared, and supported across the country. A Parsons native and graduate of Parsons High School, Davis began her higher education journey at Labette Community College, where she built the foundation for a career dedicated to expanding opportunity through education.

She went on to earn her Bachelor of Science in Education from Pittsburg State University, a Master of Science in Curriculum and Instruction from Emporia State University, and a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction from Kansas State University.

Shaped by her own educational experiences and a desire to address the absence of culturally responsive teaching in classrooms, Davis's commitment to equity began early. That purpose has guided her throughout a distinguished career spanning K–12 education, higher education, and district leadership. She has served as a classroom teacher and literacy coach in Kansas public schools, an associate professor in the College of Education at Pittsburg State University, and Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction, and Professional Development for Kansas City Public Schools, where she led large-scale academic initiatives and supported educators across dozens of schools.

Davis founded the Urban Suburban Experience (USE) minor while on staff at Pittsburg State University. This forward-thinking program was designed for preservice teachers to gain experience in large and diverse districts outside of their Southeast Kansas experience at Pitt State.

Today, Davis serves as the Founder and President of Teachers Like Me, a nationally recognized nonprofit organization focused on increasing the number of Black teachers and improving retention through innovative, wraparound support. The organization recruits aspiring educators, provides mentorship and professional development, and addresses systemic barriers—including access to affordable housing—helping teachers succeed in their first years and beyond. Her work has drawn national attention for its impact on both educator diversity and student success.

A respected voice in education, Davis is a frequent presenter on topics including literacy achievement, culturally responsive teaching, and effective classroom practices. She has served on numerous professional committees and advisory boards and is an active member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., reflecting her deep commitment to service and community leadership.

Her impact has been recognized with numerous honors, including the Labette Community College Distinguished Alumni Award (2018), the Pittsburg State University Outstanding Alumni Award (2022), the Urban League of Kansas City Difference Maker Award (2025), and recognition as a Kelly Clarkson Good Neighbor Award honoree. These accolades reflect both her professional excellence and her unwavering dedication to creating more equitable educational systems.

Despite her national influence, Davis remains deeply connected to her roots in Parsons and to Labette Community College. Her journey from LCC student to nationally recognized leader serves as a powerful example of the life-changing impact of community colleges and the opportunities they create for students to make a difference far beyond their hometowns.

Davis and her husband, Edward, are the proud parents of two children, Jade and Noah.

Abby was also actively involved on campus as a Student Ambassador, worked in the print shop through work study, and proudly represented Labette Community College as the school mascot.

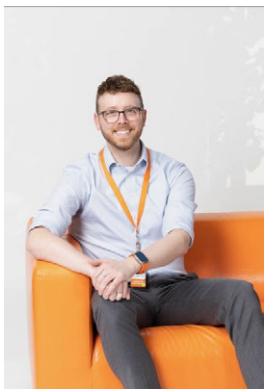

While attending LCC, he completed both the Radiologic Technology and Diagnostic Medical Sonography programs, gaining the technical skills and hands-on experience that would shape his future in medical imaging.

“The education I received at LCC gave me the confidence and skill set to step into healthcare and make an immediate impact,” McCall said. “The instructors were invested in my success and created an environment where I could grow both personally and professionally.”

Following his time at LCC, McCall earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Radiologic Technology from Missouri Southern State University and later a Master of Business Administration degree from Pittsburg State University. He has also obtained advanced specialty credentials, including Registered Diagnostic Cardiac Sonographer (RDCS) and Registered Diagnostic Medical Sonographer (RDMS), further expanding his expertise in diagnostic imaging.

McCall has dedicated more than 15 years to healthcare, including over six years in leadership roles. He currently serves as Director of Radiology and Cardiac Rehabilitation at Lakewood Health System in Staples, Minnesota, where he oversees a comprehensive range of imaging services and leads strategic initiatives focused on expanding access to care, advancing technology, and improving patient outcomes in a rural healthcare setting.

As a leader, McCall remains closely connected to the impact of education and workforce development. Three members of his team attended Labette Community College’s ultrasound program, and today, two are part of his department. He is a licensed funeral director and embalmer with Carson-Wall Funeral Homes, serving the communities of Parsons, Erie, St. Paul, and Girard, where he has worked since 1997. His commitment to the profession began early, as he started working at the funeral home, then Burriss-Carson-Wall, during his first year at Parsons High School. While attending PHS and later Labette Community College, he assisted with a variety of tasks, from washing cars to maintaining the grounds, gaining hands-on experience in all aspects of the profession. During his time at the University of Central Oklahoma, he continued building his skills while working at Baggerly-Marler Funeral Homes in Edmond and Oklahoma City. After graduating, he moved to Independence, Kansas, where he completed his apprenticeship, further preparing him for a lifetime of meaningful service.

In addition to his professional accomplishments, Mendicki is widely recognized for his exceptional leadership and civic involvement. He has been an active member of First Baptist Church, serving on various committees and the board. He has devoted more than 25 years to the Parsons Lions Club, and is a Past President and past Zone Chairman. His commitment to service extends across numerous organizations, including the Parsons Community Development Corporation and the Parsons Educational Foundation, where he currently serves as President of both boards. He is also a part of the Historic Oakwood Cemetery Improvement Board, the LCC Strategic Planning Committee, and the Public Safety Advisory Board for the Parsons Police and Fire Departments. Mendicki's leadership extends to the state and national levels through his involvement with the Kansas Funeral Directors Association (KFDA), where he has served as a board member and officer since 2016. In October 2025, he was appointed to the National Funeral Directors Association's Leadership Development Committee, where he helps interview and evaluate candidates running for positions on the organization's board of directors.

THE GRAND MARSHAL

The academic procession of Labette Community College Commencement is led by the Grand Marshal. The Grand Marshal is the individual selected by the College as Distinguished Faculty of the year. The Grand Marshal represents all members of the faculty who have participated in the learning of the individuals whose degrees are being conferred during the Commencement. This leadership is symbolic both of the leadership each faculty provides for the students of Labette Community College and the commitment that the faculty have toward the success of our students.

THE MACE

The mace had its beginning in the Middle Ages, when it was used as a heavy, armor-breaking club in protection of the king. Through the years, it has evolved into a decorative symbol of office, and today, as a symbol of order and authority. It is carried at the head of academic processions.

The Grand Marshal of the Labette Community College academic procession bears the Mace of the College. The 1998 Commencement Ceremony marked the first occasion of use for the LCC Mace. The Mace was commissioned by the LCC Foundation in celebration of the 75th Anniversary of Labette Community College. Previous LCC Graphic Design Instructor David Oldham was consulted in the design of the Mace. The design was executed by K&G Engraving of Pittsburg, Kansas.

The main features of the Mace are the Shaft, the Cube of Seals and the Golden Globe that tops this symbol of LCC. The Shaft is an adaptation of the torch of knowledge that adorns the current official seal of LCC. The Cube of Seals contains representation of the three official seals of LCC since 1923 and a fourth seal created to mark the 75th Anniversary. The Golden Globe which tops the Mace is symbolic of the comprehensive education programs taught by LCC faculty.

Distinguished Faculty Award

The Distinguished Faculty Award was developed to allow the college to publicly recognize and reward an instructor who has performed in an exemplary manner. Faculty members must be nominated by students or LCC employees to be considered by the selection committee. Criteria for the award include teaching effectiveness, college service, student involvement, and community service. All full-time faculty who have completed at least four years of full-time teaching at LCC are eligible to be nominated. The award is presented annually.

Dr. Daudi Langat



Dr. Daudi Langat has earned his Bachelor of Science in Zoology from Moi University in Kenya, Master of Science in Physiology from University of Nairobi in Kenya and Master of Science in Biology from the University of Nebraska. His PhD is in Reproductive Biology from the University of Nairobi in Kenya and he completed a 3 year post-doctoral fellowship at the University of Kansas Medical Center. He has been a full-time faculty member at LCC since 2014 and previously served as an adjunct instructor for seven years. Over that time, he has built a strong reputation for both his teaching and his commitment to student success.

In the classroom, Langat blends lectures with interactive tools and real-world examples to help students better understand complex material. He also provides additional support through online resources, giving students more opportunities to review and stay engaged with the course.

Students say what sets Langat apart is not just how he teaches, but how much he cares. One student wrote, “Dr. Langat is deserving of the Distinguished Faculty Award because he truly cares about his students and makes every effort to help them learn.”

Outside the classroom, Langat serves as an academic advisor for students in biology, pre-medicine, and secondary education. He is involved in several campus committees and represents the college at statewide meetings focused on course outcomes and transferability. He also remains active in his field through professional organizations and research review.
